White Poppies

Every year in the run up to Remembrance Day and Remembrance Sunday, PPU distributes white poppies, in memory of all victims of war. On Remembrance Sunday, events featuring white poppies take place around the UK.

White poppies were originally made in 1933 by the Co-operative Women's Guild. Today, true to its roots, the new design is made by a workers' co-operative in the UK.

The recent white poppy design is better for the environment. It is plastic-free, biodegradable and recyclable in household recycling along with paper and cardboard.
